

JOIN US FOR THE LONG TERM

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As our long-time client wineries and many others in the Northwest wine industry know, we have been making an extraordinary push for about 5 years to reimagine, replant, and enlarge the planted acreage at Windhorse Vineyard with the goal to make it the premier wine grape vineyard in the Columbia Gorge region. As the 2023 crop year unfolds, we are on the brink of expanding our portfolio of new varieties available. We expect tonnage of fruit available to increase approximately 5 fold over the next 4 years. Thus we are actively inviting new winery partners to grow with us.

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In 2023, we will have our first small harvest from our 2021 plantings of Sangiovese, Cabernet Franc, Nero d'Avola, and Grenache (see map on page 1: blocks 6, 7, 8, and 9, respectively). In 2024, we will have first harvest from our 2022 planting of Grenache, Sangiovese and Primitivo (blocks 2, 3, and 10a, respectively). Finally, in 2026, we will have first harvest from our 2024 planting of more Cabernet Franc, Nero d'Avola, and Primitivo (blocks 4, 5, and 10b, respectively). Blocks 4, 5, and 10b will provide substantially increased tonnages of these desirable grape varieties.

Our long-term goal is to provide exceptional fruit to exceptional wineries in the Columbia Gorge and Willamette Valley areas. Our vision is to build long-term relationships with wineries desiring 4- to 6-ton or greater quantities of grapes per variety, ideally through acreage contracts of entire variety blocks.

CERTIFICATION

Windhorse Vineyard is LIVE and Salmon Safe Certified. We are certified sustainable in the LIVE program (Low Input Viticulture & Enology: https://livecertified.org/). Every year, every aspect of our farming practices and the materials we use, such as fertilizers, fungicides and pesticides, are logged, documented, and 3rd-party independently verified to meet international sustainability standards.

In addition, we meet or exceed the standards to be certified Salmon Safe (https://salmonsafe.org), meaning that our farming practices protect water quality and maintain watershed health for anadromous fishes, such as salmon and steelhead.
